



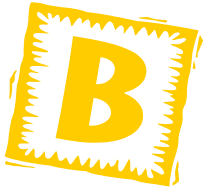
The ABC's of Golf



Ace - Hole in One

Albatross - Three under Par, also known as a Double Eagle

Away - The ball farthest from the hole, the person that is away goes first



Ball Marker - Small token used to mark the place your ball landed on the green

Birdie - One under Par

Bogey - One over Par

Break - The turns and dips on the green

Bunker - Sand filled hazard on the golf course, also know as a sand trap



Caddie - Person hired to carry clubs and assist with club selection

Chip - Short shot near the green that puts the ball in the air then rolls to the hole

Cup - Another name for the golf hole



Divot - Hole or mark on the golf course caused by striking the ground with your club

Divot Repair Tool - Used to fix divots or ball marks on the golf course

Dogleg - A fairway that curves to one side or the other

Double Bogey - Two over Par

Double Eagle - Three under Par, also known as an Albatross

Drive - A full swing shot with the driver

Driver - Type of club that is part of the wood family, used for longest distance



The ABC's of Golf



Eagle - Two under Par (also the best junior golf program in the world!)

Etiquette - Good manners; the rules every golfer must obey



Fairway - The short grass between the tee box and the green

Flag - Marks each hole on the golf course

Fore - Warning signal to alert other golfers that a ball is headed in their direction

Fringe - The edge of the green

Full Swing - Type of golf shot where the club completely circles the body



Gimme - When the ball is so close to the hole, it is assumed you won't miss

Golf - The best sport in the world; for kids of all ages

Green - The shortest grass on the golf course where the hole is located

Grip - Refers to the short handle of the club or the way in which you hold the club

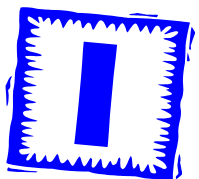


Hazard - Refers to the sand or water on a golf course, put there to make the game more difficult

Hole - Where you want the ball to go

Hole in One - Sinking the ball in the hole in only one stroke, also known as an ace

Honesty - Always telling the truth and never cheating at a game



Hook - A shot that curves from the right to left (for a right handed golfer)

Iron - A type of golf club



The ABC's of Golf



Par - The number of shots you are supposed to take on a hole

Pitch - Type of golf swing that launches the ball high in the air

Putter - Type of golf club used to putt the ball in the hole



Ready Position - The proper golf stance

Respect - Treating other people and things the way you want to be treated

Rough - The long grass on the sides of the fairway and green



Scorecard - Used to keep track of your score and tells you par for each hole

Slice - A shot that curves from the left to right (for a right handed golfer)

Sportsmanship - Playing by the rules and showing respect to our playing partners

Stroke - When the golfer hits the ball; we keep score by counting strokes



Tee - Used only in the tee box, to raise the ball off the ground

Tee Box - Area at the beginning of each hole where you take your first stroke; also known as the Teeing Ground

Towel - Can be carried in your golf bag to wipe your hands or dry your ball

Triple Bogey - Three over Par



Water Hazard - Body of water on the course, if your ball lands in the water you must take a penalty stroke
